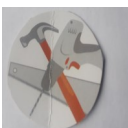

Sister Wilhelmina Lancaster, OSB

Hundreds of pilgrims have been visiting the Benedictine Monastery for the sisters of Mary, Queen of the Apostles, in Gower, Missouri these past days, when the recently exhumed remains of the contemplative order’s African American foundress Sister Wilhelmina Lancaster, appeared to be incorrupt, four years after her death and burial in a simple wooden coffin. Sister Wilhelmina died at the age of 95 on May 29th, 2019, on the vigil of the solemnity of the Ascension. When the community decided to exhume her body to transfer it to a final resting place inside their monastery chapel, they were expecting to find bones. The body was not embalmed, and the exhumed wooden coffin had a crack down the middle that let in moisture and dirt. The Sisters were shocked to view the intact incorrupt body of Sister Wilhelmina. Incorruptible saints give witness to the truth of the resurrection of the body and the life that is to come. The lack of decay is also seen as a sign of holiness. Sister Wilhelmina’s body is laid out in the sister’s chapel until May 29th, when on the anniversary of her death, her body shall be placed near the altar in a new glass casket. As we prepare for the Feast of Pentecost, we are encouraged by the witness of the Saints who remind us of the life of grace.

Cemetery Request
Memorial displays (flower pots and stands, flag poles, small statues, etc.) are allowed if kept in line with monuments (north-south) on the west end of the graves spaces, normally called the headstone area. There is a limit on items placed there. All pots must be in pot stands, elevated above the ground. Artificial floral pieces may remain in the cemetery the entire year, if displayed as listed above. However, if they are badly faded, they must be removed. Three days before Memorial Day and until May 30th, flowers and other displays may be placed on the grave. After that time, they must be removed, or placed as outlined above. Cemetery caretakers will remove any piece remaining after that period that does not follow the guidelines. Also, floral wreaths left after a burial will be removed when they become unsightly. The caretaker and/or the Board have the authority to remove any items considered unsightly, or above the number of items allowed. These rules are to assure the cemetery is neat and easy to mow. Calvary Cemetery is not responsible for protection or maintenance of any item. Thank you for your cooperation!!!
